# Scripture:

# Joshua 5:9 (NIV)

"Then the Lord said to Joshua, "Today I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." So the place has been called Gilgal to this day."

One of the beautiful parts of the story of the Israelites entering the promised land, is where they renew their covenant with God. These were the children of those who came out of Egypt but perished in the wilderness because of their disobedience. God wants to renew His covenant with this new generation so that they can take their inheritance. The younger generation, who hadn't been circumcised, needed to undergo this key covenantal sign and in so doing renew God's covenant with the nation.

It's after they've done this that God declares, "This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." This signifies a fresh start, a removal of past shame, and a renewed identity as the people of God.

As we approach God in prayer, let us search our hearts for anything that needs to be "cut off", things that stand between us and the Lord so that we can renew our covenant relationship with Him and position ourselves to receive His promises over our lives.

## The Bible says in:

**Joel 2:13 (NIV)** "Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity."

What the Lord desires is a wholehearted devotion that is borne out If a surrendered heart. We must not offer the lip service but a genuine turning from all that keeps us from truly surrendering to Him. When we do so, He will extend His mercy towards us and keep us from the consequences of that sin. Renew your relationship with Him today so that you may be forgiven, saved and blessed.

#### **Prayer**

# **Prayer Points**

#### **Personal**

- Ask for a return to righteousness and godliness in all sectors of society, and for the uprooting of corruption, injustice, and immorality.
- Pray that the Lord continues to open doors to the preaching of the gospel across our nation so that many will return to the Lord.
- Pray for a time of renewal of the fear of God in the nation, that we will return to God as a nation and see His blessing come upon us (Psalm 33:12)

# Prepare Your Battle Strategy



#### Joshua 6:15-16(NIV)

"On the seventh day, they got up at daybreak and marched around the city seven times in the same manner, except that on that day they circled the city seven times. 16 The seventh time around, when the priests sounded the trumpet blast, Joshua commanded the army, "Shout! For the Lord has given you the city!"

The Battle of Jericho is one those famous Bible stories because it's a story of vicory in a humanly impossible situation. It highlights how we need to relay on God's divine strategy to overcome life's battles. Just as Joshua and the Israelites followed God's unique battle plan to see the walls of Jericho fall, we too are called to rely on God's guidance for victory in our spiritual battles.

The word "battle" signifies warfare, and as children of God, we are engaged in spiritual warfare. When God gives us Bold Vision, and we embrace it with Strong Conviction; it's inevitable that we'll start to have obstacles. We must learn to approach whatever battle we face and prepare a battle strategy similar to what the Israelites did.

We must rely on God to give us the right battle strategy. The Israelites' victory over Jericho wasn't achieved by strength or conventional tactics but by following God's specific instructions. At that point, the crucial next step is to respond with obedience. God gave Joshua specific instructions on how (strategy) they would get the victory over Jericho.

It was only after a strong conviction in the Bold Vision that God gave them, that they were able to courageously act in obedience to His instructions. The result is that the walls of Jericho came crashing down and the Israelites were able to advance and conquer their enemies.

#### **Prayer**

Father, We bring before You the "Jerichos" in our lives—those challenges that seem impossible to overcome. Teach us to listen closely to Your instructions, trusting Your guidance even when the path is unclear. Give us the strength to wait on You to see us through and to follow you way out of every battle we face. We trust for victory in every battle. In Jesus' name. Amen.

# **Prayer Direction**

#### Personal & Family:

Thank God for significant life breakthroughs (e.g., salvation, healing, provision).



- Pray for God's purposes to be fulfilled in your life and family.
- Ask for strength, deliverance and victory for specific battles (e.g., depression, poverty, sickness) you are facing.

#### Church:

- Praise God for Watoto Ministries' victories over the last 40 years.
- Ask God to give us Godly strategy over every obstacle we could face as we step into the future He has for us.
- Intercede for the global church to remain steadfast in Christ.

## Nation:

- Thank God for blessings like peace, freedom of worship, and provision.
- Pray for divine strategy to push back against the forces of darkness in our nation in the key areas such as education, economy and politics.
- Trust God for Godly leaders to lead the country into a future that follows God's divine strategy for the nation.



# **Joshua 7:13 (NIV)**

"Go, consecrate the people. Tell them, 'Consecrate yourselves in preparation for tomorrow; for this is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says: There are devoted things among you, Israel. You cannot stand against your enemies until you remove them."

All of Israel recognized Joshua as Moses' successor, empowered by God's presence to pursue a **BOLD VISION**: leading them across the Jordan to possess Canaan. The people pledged their loyalty to him.

After Jericho's walls miraculously collapsed (Joshua 6), they were instructed to destroy all living things in the city except for Rahab and her household. The silver, gold, and bronze items were sacred to the Lord and devoted to His treasury. They were warned against taking any devoted things, as it would bring trouble upon Israel.

However, in Joshua 7, we learn that the Israelites were unfaithful. The sin of one had become the sin of all. When facing Ai, Joshua assumed victory with a small army, but they were defeated. Confused, Joshua sought the Lord, who revealed that there was sin in the camp. The Lord, through Joshua, called for the people to consecrate themselves, warning that without obedience, they could not stand against their enemies.

To consecrate is to intentionally separate oneself from what defiles, to separate oneself from all manner of sin and evil out of love and devotion to the holy Lord.

Joshua, at this point, carried a **STRONG CONVICTION** to rid the camp of sin, and so he did as the Lord instructed. Achan had hidden some devoted things for himself, and by the leading of the Lord, he was found out. Joshua took **COURAGEOUS ACTION** and killed Achan and his entire family. This was done to rid the camp of sin and restore the Lord's favor, enabling victory over their enemies in the promised land.

Just as He did with Joshua and the Israelites, God still calls us to consecrate ourselves by acknowledging our sinfulness, asking for and receiving His mercy so that we can avoid the destructive power of sin in our lives. God is holy and commands that we must live holy lives. We all battle with the lure of sin daily. That is why we must consecrate ourselves daily. The Holy Spirit is available to help us cultivate a consecrated life so that we may experience God's blessing in every area of our lives. No sin is hidden from the Lord. Therefore, we must deal with all sin in our lives urgently and decisively. This is pleasing to the Lord and guarantees His continued presence and blessing in our lives.



# Prayer:

Lord, I acknowledge that my sin deeply offends you and opens up my life to sin's destructive power. I also acknowledge that my sin will affect my family, city, and nation. However, I also know that you are a God of compassion, slow to anger, and rich in love. Forgive me for all my sins, known and unknown. Holy Spirit, may you fuel my conviction to deal with all sin in my life. Teach me to live a life consecrated to the Lord so that your favor and blessing may continue to flow in and through my life, in Jesus' name, Amen!

# **Prayer Points:**

# Acknowledge and repent of all sin.

- Personal sin pride, arrogance, anger, bitterness, lust, and all forms of sexual immorality, greed, envy, jealousy, laziness, lying, cheating, prayerlessness, broken promises, etc.
- Family Divorce, absentee and irresponsible parents, witchcraft, property wrangles, etc.
- Church disunity, gossip, slander, false teaching, manipulation, lack of financial integrity, sexual sin, celebrity culture, etc.
- National corruption, lack of servant leadership, injustice, oppression, shedding innocent bloodshed, tribalism, witchcraft, etc.

# Spend time in consecration.

- Stand against demonic powers that hold us in bondage to sin as individuals, families, churches, and nations.
- Pray for salvation in our families and nation. Ask the Lord to revive the preaching of the true gospel across the nation. Ask the Lord to raise preachers of the gospel.
- Call on the Holy Spirit to fuel a strong conviction for holiness in our lives, families, churches, and nation. Ask the Lord to help us act courageously and confront sin so that we may see a return to holiness.

#### Spend time in Thanksgiving.

- Give thanks to the Lord for forgiving all our sin (personal, family, church & nation).
- Give thanks to the Lord for breaking the demonic power of sin.
- Give thanks to the Lord for salvation in your family and nation.
- Give thanks to God for a revival of the preaching of the true gospel.
- Give thanks to God for godly leadership in our nation that will fight sin in all its forms.



In **Joshua 7:4-5**, Israel was defeated at Ai because there was sin in the camp. A man named Acan had hidden for himself items God had instructed the people of Israel not to take. Their defeat exposed the truth that God was not with Israel in the battle at Ai. Without God's continued blessing, presence, and protection, Israel could never defeat their enemies.

However, in **Joshua 7:10-26**, having found out what Acan had done, Joshua and all of Israel dealt with the sin of Acan that led to the battle loss at Ai by destroying him and his family. This bold act of obedience to God led to God's response in:

#### **Joshua 8:1-2 (NIV)**

"Then the Lord said to Joshua, "Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Take the whole army with you, and go up and attack Ai. For I have delivered into your hands the king of Ai, his people, his city and his land. You shall do to Ai and its king as you did to Jericho and its king, except that you may carry off their plunder and livestock for yourselves. Set an ambush behind the city."

Once again Israel could receive encouragement and the assurance of God's Presence as they went to engage Ai. Here are some thoughts we get from the portion of scripture above. Once we deal with sin in our lives;

# 1. God guarantees our victory Joshua 8:1 NIV

"Then the Lord said to Joshua, "Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Take the whole army with you, and go up and attack Ai. For I have delivered into your hands the king of Ai, his people, his city and his land."

As we go about life, Victory over our enemies and God's enemies in our lives and against our lives can only be guaranteed by God. He holds the victory over all and has already over come. The first time Israel went against Ai, they were defeated, because the presence of God was not with them. Their victory did not depend on their experience, their numbers, armies or resources. I depended on God and this is the same for us in life. Our victory is guaranteed by God.

# 2. God gives us the plan Joshua 8:2 NIV

"You shall do to Ai and its king as you did to Jericho and its king, except that you may



carry off their plunder and livestock for yourselves. Set an ambush behind the city." God gave Joshua instructions to attack Ai because He had given them Ai. However, in attacking them, God specified to Joshua the following:

- take the whole army
- Carry their plunder and livestock for yourselves
- Set an ambush behind the city

As the story develops, we see that Joshua led the army to execute exactly as God had instructed and this plan was different from the first plan the Israelites had used.

This is the same for us. In order to experience God's victory in our lives against our enemies, we must ask God for guidance and a plan which we shall obey and follow faithfully. This demonstrates our dependance on God for Victory.

Therefore, in response let's consider the following as prayer points:

#### **REPENT:**

- Repent and deal with any sin in your life.
- Repent of sin in your family.
- Stand in the gap and repent of the sins of the nation of Uganda.

# **CALL ON THE HOLY SPIRIT:**

- Ask the Holy Spirit to empower you to live a life of obedience to the Lord.
- Pray that your family will stay away from sinful practices that'll destroy your family (unresolved anger, bitterness, witchcraft, cheating, stealing, divorce, abortion, alcohol and drug abuse etc.)

## **STAND AGAINST GOD'S ENEMIES:**

- Take authority over every demonic power that leads us into cycles of sin and defeat. Cast it out in the name of Jesus (Ephesians 6:12-20)
- Take time and listen to the Lord for your battle strategy. Ask Him to show you so that you can gain advantage over the enemy and prosper



# Joshua 9:3-6; 14-15; 22-24 (NLT)

But when the people of Gibeon heard what Joshua had done to Jericho and Ai, they resorted to deception to save themselves. They sent ambassadors to Joshua, loading their donkeys with weathered saddlebags and old, patched wineskins. They put on wornout, patched sandals and ragged clothes. And the bread they took with them was dry and moldy. When they arrived at the camp of Israel at Gilgal, they told Joshua and the men of Israel, "We have come from a distant land to ask you to make a peace treaty with us." ... So the Israelites examined their food, but they did not consult the Lord. Then Joshua made a peace treaty with them and guaranteed their safety, and the leaders of the community ratified their agreement with a binding oath.

...Joshua called together the Gibeonites and said, "Why did you lie to us? Why did you say that you live in a distant land when you live right here among us? May you be cursed! From now on you will always be servants who cut wood and carry water for the house of my God." They replied, "We did it because we—your servants—were clearly told that the Lord your God commanded his servant Moses to give you this entire land and to destroy all the people living in it. So we feared greatly for our lives because of you. That is why we have done this.

In continuing with the bold, strong and courageous conquest of the promised land, Joshua and the Israelites were commanded by God to destroy all the people living in these lands, lest they are tempted to embrace their idolatrous practices, attracting God's judgement. However, in this portion of Scripture, we see the Gibeonites hatching a deceptive plan to save themselves, which plan succeeded because according to **Joshua 9:14**, <u>Joshua and the leaders didn't inquire of the LORD.</u>

From the garden of Eden to today, Satan seeks to hinder people from inheriting God's promises for through his deceptive schemes, no wonder in **Revelations 12:9**, Satan is referred to as the deceiver of the whole world.

### Reflection:

Its therefore important that as we pursue God's bold vision for our lives, family, Church and nation for 2025, we need to:

- Walk daily in obedience to the instructions of God in His Word as a lamp unto our feet and light for our path.
- Seek God's direction in prayer concerning all major decisions before stepping out in courageous action so that we do not fall victim to Satan's deceptive schemes and forfeit God's good plans.



Other Scriptural references: Proverbs 3:5-6, Jeremiah 29:11-13, Acts 17:26-28, 1 Corinthians 2:9-12

# **Prayer Points:**

# 1). Personal & Family

- Thank God for guiding and protecting you and your family through 2024 to accomplish His good plans.

# Your God is Greater!



# Scripture: Joshua 10:5-26 (NIV)

Then the five kings of the Amorites—the kings of Jerusalem, Hebron, Jarmuth, Lachish and Eglon—joined forces. They moved up with all their troops and took up positions against Gibeon and attacked it.

The Gibeonites then sent word to Joshua in the camp at Gilgal: "Do not abandon your servants. Come up to us quickly and save us! Help us, because all the Amorite kings from the hill country have joined forces against us."

So Joshua marched up from Gilgal with his entire army, including all the best fighting men. The Lord said to Joshua, "Do not be afraid of them; I have given them into your hand. Not one of them will be able to withstand you."

After an all-night march from Gilgal, Joshua took them by surprise. The Lord threw them into confusion before Israel, so Joshua and the Israelites defeated them completely at Gibeon. Israel pursued them along the road going up to Beth Horon and cut them down all the way to Azekah and Makkedah. As they fled before Israel on the road down from Beth Horon to Azekah, the Lord hurled large hailstones down on them, and more of them died from the hail than were killed by the swords of the Israelites. On the day the Lord gave the Amorites over to Israel, Joshua said to the Lord in the presence of Israel:

"Sun, stand still over Gibeon, and you, moon, over the Valley of Aijalon." So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, till the nation avenged itself on[a] its enemies, as it is written in the Book of Jashar.

The sun stopped in the middle of the sky and delayed going down about a full day.

There has never been a day like it before or since, a day when the Lord listened to a human being. Surely the Lord was fighting for Israel! Then Joshua returned with all Israel to the camp at Gilgal.

# Five Amorite Kings Killed

Now the five kings had fled and hidden in the cave at Makkedah. When Joshua was told that the five kings had been found hiding in the cave at Makkedah, he said, "Roll large rocks up to the mouth of the cave, and post some men there to guard it. But don't stop; pursue your enemies! Attack them from the rear and don't let them reach their cities, for the Lord your God has given them into your hand." So Joshua and the Israelites defeated them completely, but a few survivors managed to reach their fortified cities.



The whole army then returned safely to Joshua in the camp at Makkedah, and no one uttered a word against the Israelites.

Joshua said, "Open the mouth of the cave and bring those five kings out to me." So they brought the five kings out of the cave—the kings of Jerusalem, Hebron, Jarmuth, Lachish and Eglon. When they had brought these kings to Joshua, he summoned all the men of Israel and said to the army commanders who had come with him, "Come here and put your feet on the necks of these kings." So they came forward and placed their feet on their necks. Joshua said to them, "Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Be strong and courageous. This is what the Lord will do to all the enemies you are going to fight." Then Joshua put the kings to death and exposed their bodies on five poles, and they were left hanging on the poles until evening.

# **Devotional thought:**

In today's passage we see that because of the victory that the Israelites had experienced with the cities of Jericho and Ai, the Canaanites instead of being in awe of the God of the Israelites, they instead decided to gang up and attack the city of Gibeon which had sworn allegiance to Joshua and the Israelites. It is interesting to note that Joshua had entered into a treaty or covenant with the Gibeonites, something that he should not have done. Joshua took it upon himself to keep the oath he had sworn to the Gibeonites. Five kings had ganged up against Gibeon to teach them a lesson. Joshua is reassured and commanded by God "Don't fear" as all of the Canaanites would be destroyed. Joshua attacked these five kings in faith because he knew that his God was greater than all these kings put together. Two miracles happened pointing to the greatness of our God.

- 1. As the Canaanite army fled, large hailstones fell from heaven killing more of the Canaanites than those who were killed by the sword. This was a display of the greatness of God because none of the Israelites died due to the hailstones from heaven.
- 2. When Joshua saw the greatness of God and how God was fighting for them, he made a very bold prayer. He prayed that the sun would stand still and the moon to stop. The lord heard and answered this bold prayer from Joshua. Indeed, our God is great.

Our God is the same yesterday, today and forever. What He did yesterday, He is more than able to do today.

### **Prayer:**

Lord, we honor you for your greatness. We pray that your greatness will be reveled in our personal lives, in our families, in our church and our nation.



# **Prayer direction:**

#### **Personal:**

- Thank God for His greatness in your life.
- Make some bold prayers in your life. Where do you need go to see His greatness?

# **Family**

- Thank God for the greatness of God in your family
- Pray bold prayers for your family. Ask God to move in such a way that your family testifies of the greatness of our God.

#### Church

- Thank God for his greatness in the church today.
- Pray for God's greatness to shine through the global church
- Pray that our local church, Watoto Church will experience a great move of God's Spirit.

## **Nation**

- Thank God for the great things that He has done in our nation.
- Pray that God will do some even greater things in our nation this year economically, politically, etc.



# Scripture: Joshua 13:1-6 (NIV).

"When Joshua had grown old, the LORD said to him, "You are now very old, and there are still very large areas of land to be taken over. "This is the land that remains: all the regions of the Philistines and Geshurites, from the Shihor River on the east of Egypt to the territory of Ekron on the north, all of it counted as Canaanite though held by the five Philistine rulers in Gaza, Ashdod, Ashkelon, Gath and Ekron; the territory of the Avvites on the south; all the land of the Canaanites, from Arah of the Sidonians as far as Aphek and the border of the Amorites; the area of Byblos; and all Lebanon to the east, from Baal Gad below Mount Hermon to Lebo Hamath. "As for all the inhabitants of the mountain regions from Lebanon to Misrephoth Maim, that is, all the Sidonians, I myself will drive them out before the Israelites. Be sure to allocate this land to Israel for an inheritance, as I have instructed you..."

"There Is More" is a phrase that echoes in our hearts and minds. It's a reminder that there's more to life than what we're currently experiencing, more than our circumstances, limitations, fears and dreams. The bible describes how God informs Joshua that there is still land in Canaan that needs to be conquered and divided among the tribes of Israel.

At some point in our lives, we tend to feel like we have accomplished so much, we have done enough, we have accomplished what God called us to do. But God is saying to us all ,"There remains yet very much land to possess." just like he did to Joshua. The Lord still reminds us that There is more, more land to possess, more battles to win, more victories to experience. The key to experiencing more is trusting God as seen in **Joshua 13:6** that says, "The Lord your God will push them back before you, and drive them out of your sight; and you shall possess their land, as the Lord your God promised you."

The message of **Joshua 13:1-6** is clear: there is more, Don't settle for less and always Trust God for more. He has promised us an inheritance, and He will help us possess it. So, let's not settle for less. Let's not be content with the status quo. Let's press in, let's seek God more, and let's trust that God will do exceedingly and abundantly above all that we ask or think in us.

#### Scriptures to reflect on:

Luke 22:24-27, John 13:1-17, Deuteronomy 4:37-39, proverbs 3:5-6.



# **Prayer Direction**

- Pray that God will open your eyes to see the greatness in us.
- Pray that God will Help you to trust in his plan for your life and to be obedient to his calling. (Joshua 13:1)
